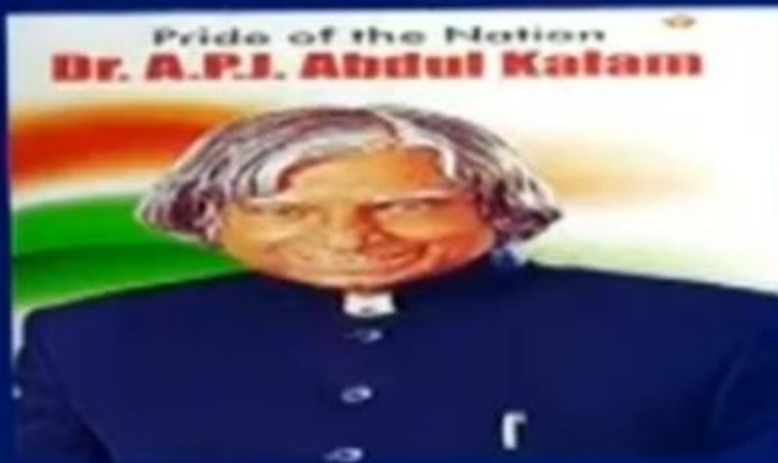

RAMESHWARAM IN TAMIL NADU

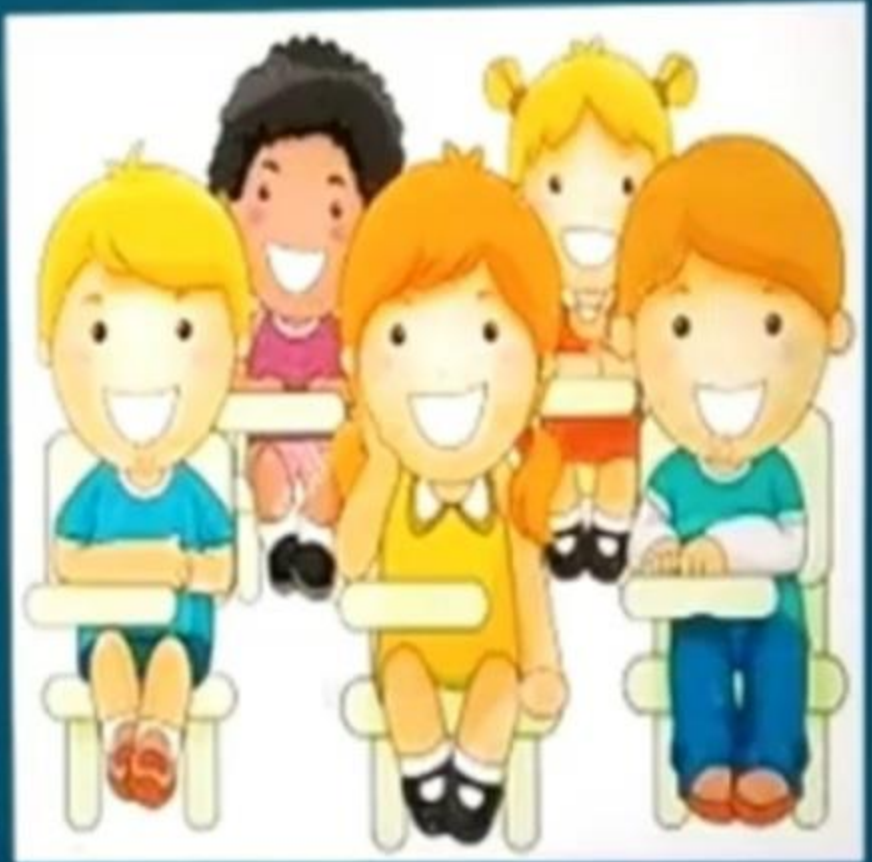
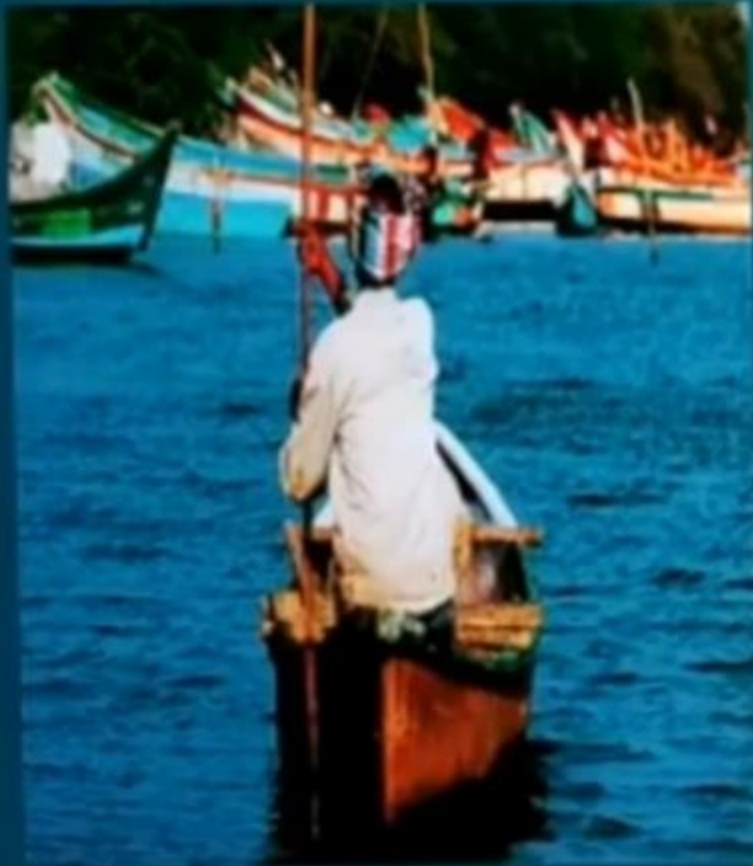

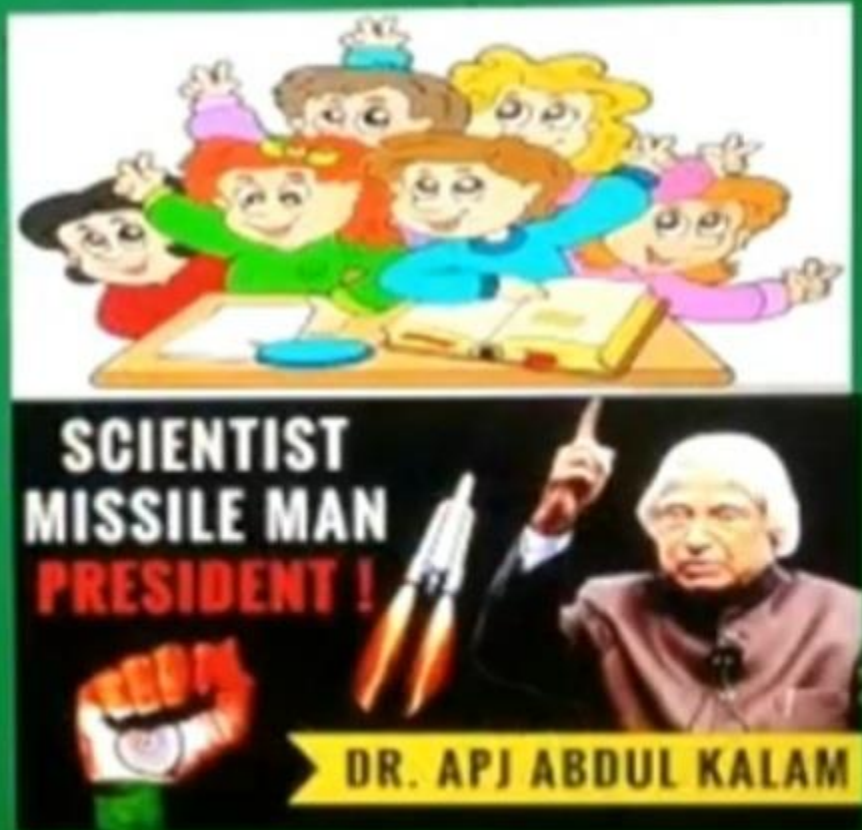

in order to have a better future.

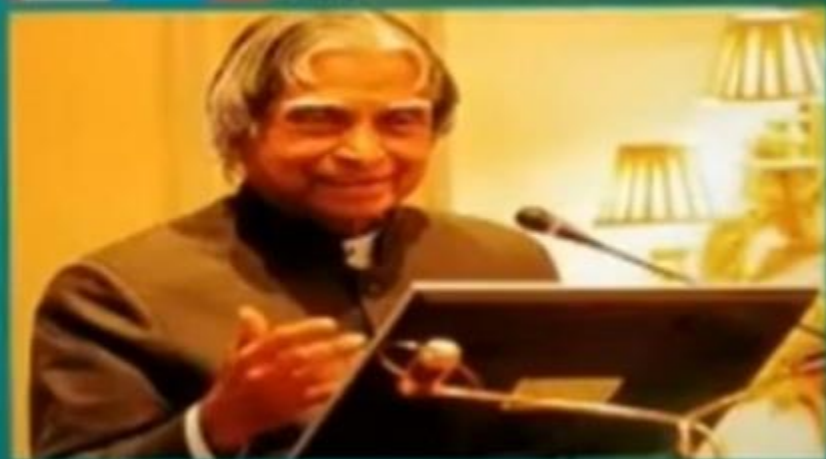

All children must go to school. They cannot fulfill their dreams or do anything for the development of our country without education.

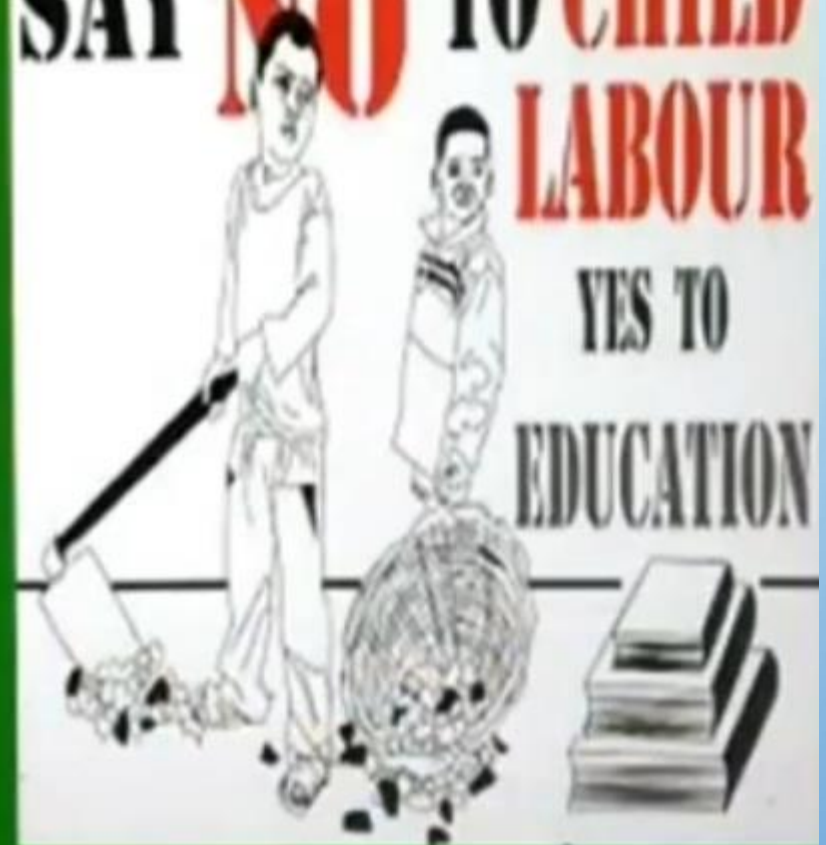
