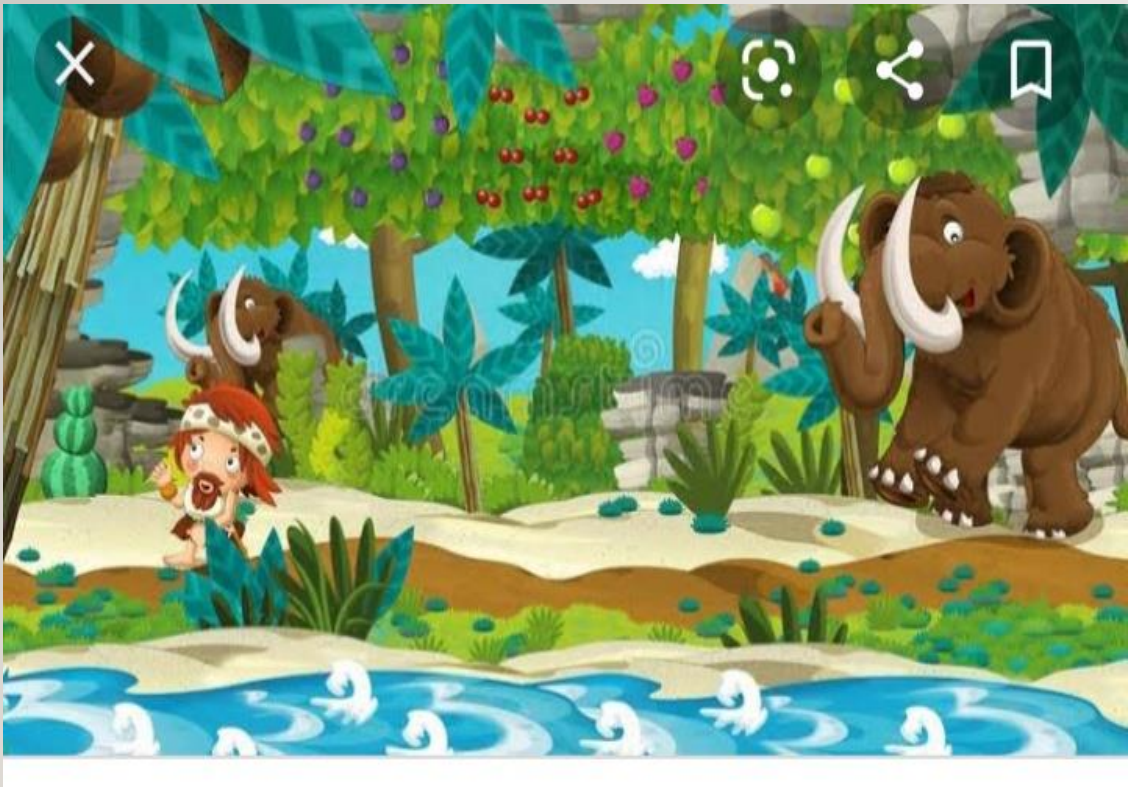

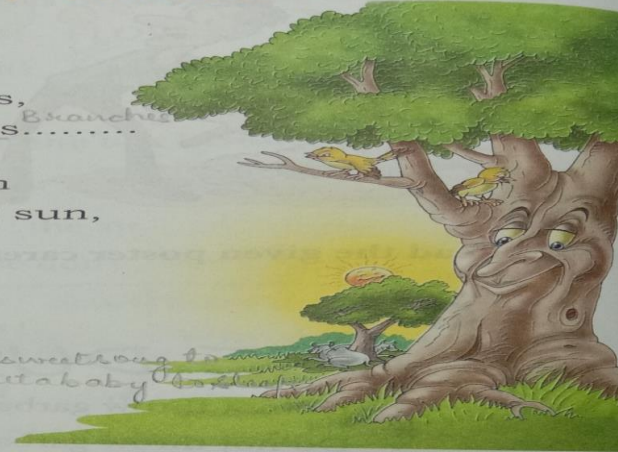
## TREES ARE THE KINDEST THINGS I KNOW
